WHAT IS THE NOISE EXPOSURE MAP (NEM) UPDATE?

This NEM update will include updating all Airport noise contours, noise exposure maps, and submission to the FAA. The last FAA-accepted Noise Exposure Map was completed in 2001 and the last updated noise contours were completed in 2017. As the general aviation fleet mix changes and traffic levels fluctuate it is important to periodically update the NEM in order to accurately and effectively respond to noise concerns from the surrounding community.



IS THERE A COMMITTEE FOR THE NEM UPDATE?

The NEM update process involved establishing a Noise Technical Advisory Committee (NTAC). The committee included homeowners, HOA's, pilots, airport tenants, and City officials. The NTAC committee met to discuss the assumptions and inputs related to the NEM Update, while also gathering feedback from community representatives and members.



IS THE PUBLIC INVOLVED IN THE NEM UPDATE?

Extensive study and public outreach were conducted as part of the NEM update. The BRAA held public meetings and NTAC meetings over the course of the NEM Update. The public has had the opportunity to participate in each meeting and provide comments.
